Five-film set begins Friday, June 2

(New Orleans, La.) - The popular Dinner and a Zoovie series at Audubon Zoo returns for a fifth season with a lineup of five family-friendly films, beginning with the Academy Award-nominated computer-animated feature "Moana" on Friday, June 2. Gates open at 6 p.m. and the movie starts at 8 p.m.

The Friday evening summer screenings on the Capital One Field will continue with four more ZOOvies, starting with "Secret Life of Pets" on June 16 and "The Lego Batman Movie" on June 30. Two more ZOOvies' will follow in July.

Movie admission is \$6 and an additional \$6 for admission to Cool Zoo/Gator Run (children under two years of age receive complimentary admission to both).

ZOOvie tickets are available for purchase online, at the Zoo, at Audubon Aquarium of the Americas and at Audubon Butterfly Garden and Insectarium and will be on sale at the Zoo on the night of each showing. Buying tickets ahead of time is recommended to ensure speedier entry.

Online ticket sales will be available up to 5:30 p.m. on the day of each ZOOvie. After 5:30 p.m., tickets can be purchased at the Zoo. Anyone purchasing \$12 Cool Zoo/movie combo tickets online or in person must pick up wrist bands at the Zoo entrance.
